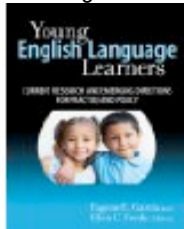

The featured keynote speaker, **Dr. Eugene García**, Vice President for Education Partnerships at Arizona State University (ASU), Chair of the National Task Force on Early Education for Hispanic Members, Professor and former Dean of the Mary Lou Fulton College of Education at ASU, will focus on anti-immigrant, anti-educational policies that are negatively impacting English learner students in U.S. schools, particularly Latinos in Arizona and California. Dr. García will focus on ways to resist the *new* [anti] social reform movement. Thereafter, a total of 30 break-out sessions covering a range of topics will be presented by faculty, teachers, administrators, graduate students, and community activists. *[Note: some sessions may be repeated twice, or they may last two hours.
