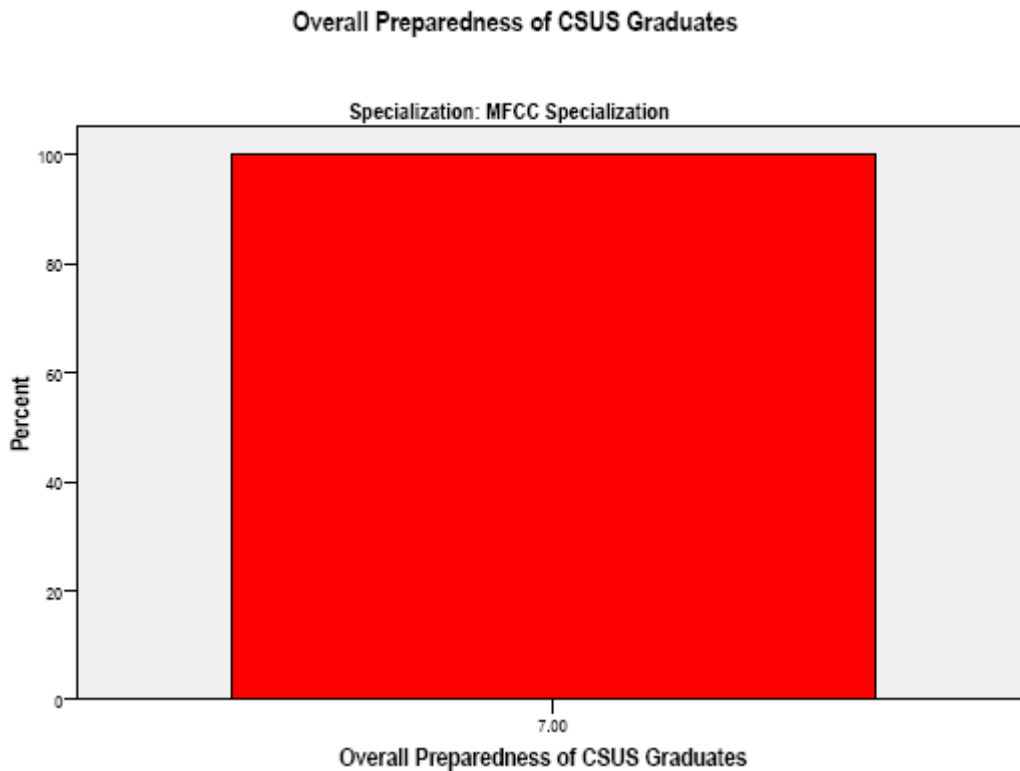


Employer Evaluations:
MFCC Specialization

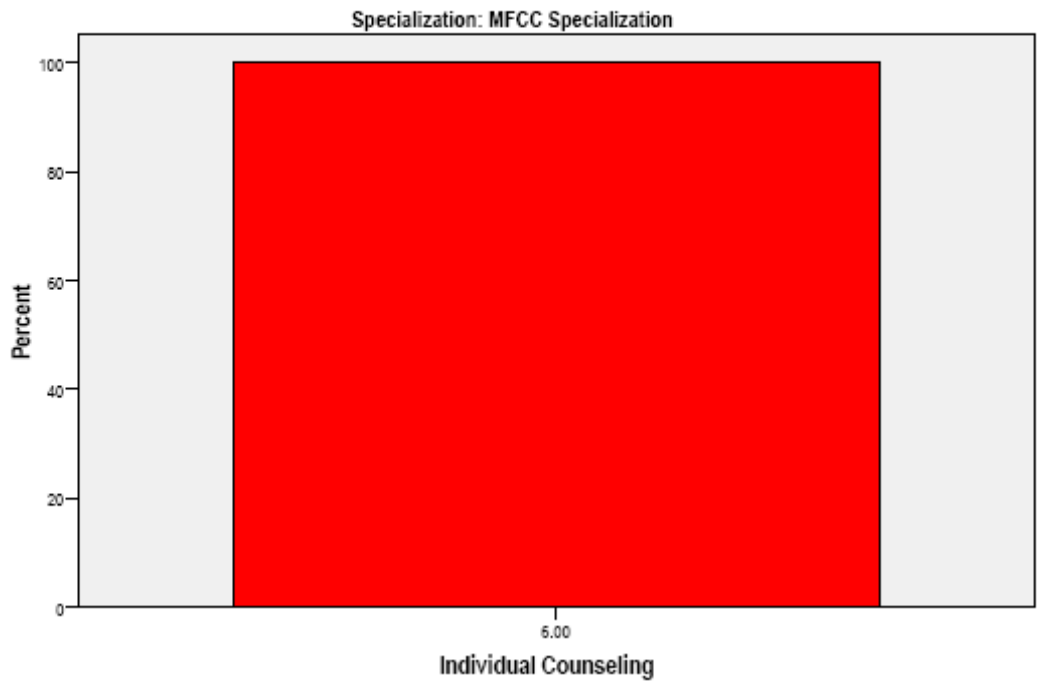

The following data reflect the Employer ratings of Alumni / Alumnae from the School Specialization.

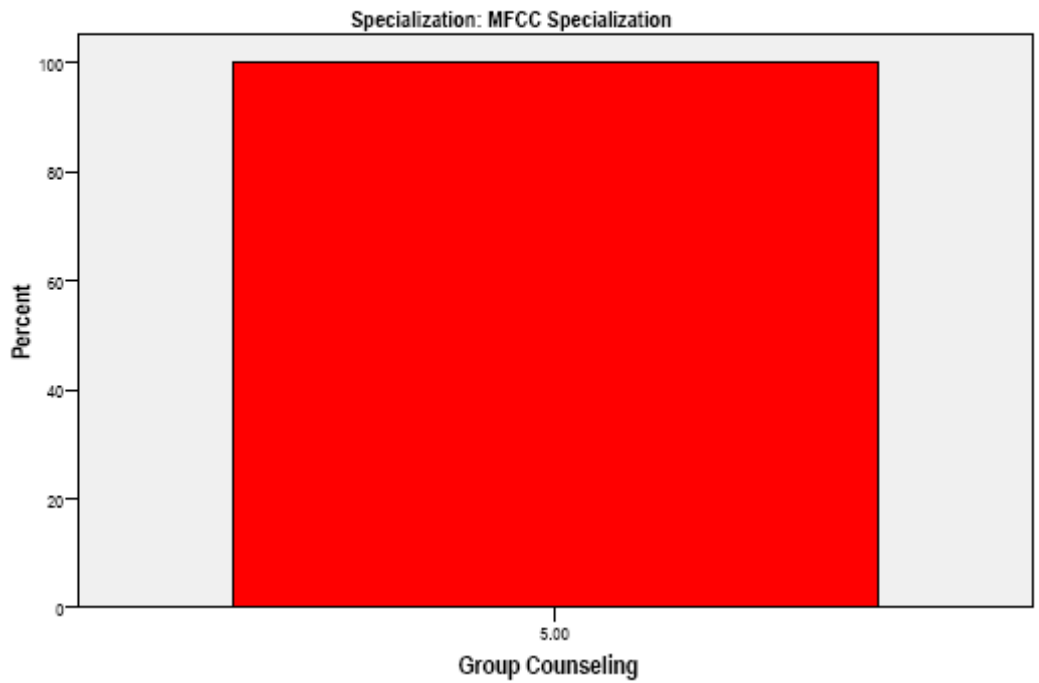
**All data were on a 1-8 Likert scale where 1 = “VERY POOR” to 7 = “EXCELLENT.
An 8 indicates “NOT APPLICABLE.”**



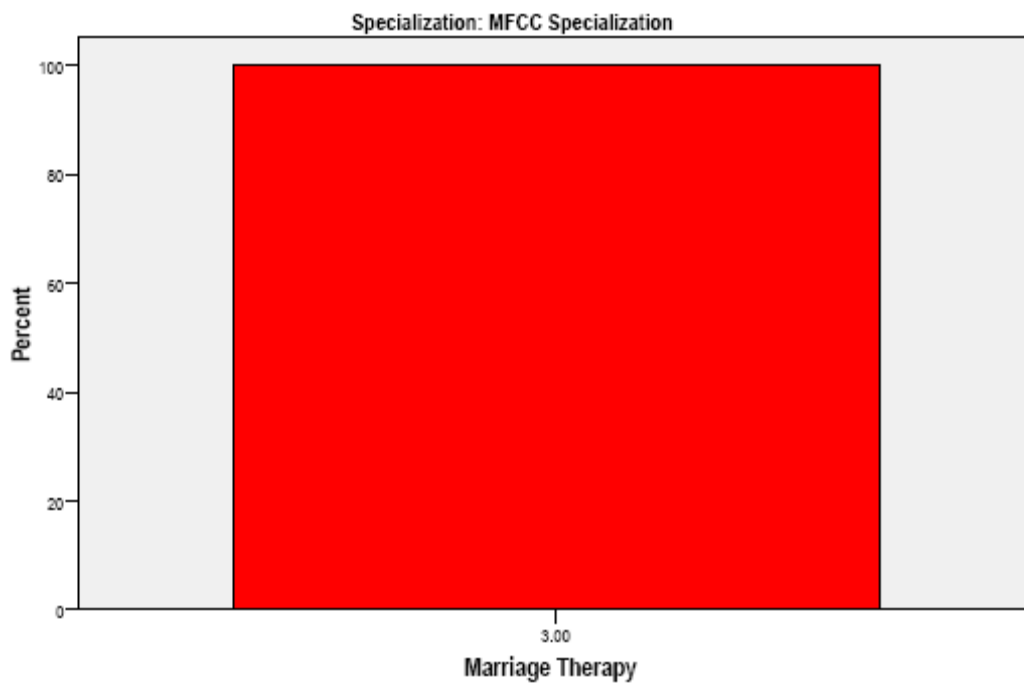
