The Department of Teacher Education offers these *undergraduate courses*:

EDTE 10 Critical Thinking

This course examines formal logic, decision making, bias in the media, and critical thinking, both in college academic disciplines and in the K-12 public education system.

This course meets GE Requirements for: Area A3 Critical Thinking.

EDTE 21 Freshman Seminar: Becoming an Educated Person

While learning about academic life, students gain familiarity with CSUS services and prepare for a successful college career.

This course meets GE Requirements for: Area E Understanding Personal Development.

EDTE 101A/B – 105A/B Tutoring Children

Students learn the basics of tutoring and then spend time in public schools assisting classroom teachers in this vital work. Tutoring will occur in reading, math, and science.

EDTE 120 Children's Literature

This course provides a foundation in historical and modern children's literature, while students become acquainted with leading authors and illustrators, procedures and practices.

EDTE 121 Multicultural Children's Literature

While enjoying children's literature representing the diversity of people in America, students will discover the cultural values, identity and heritage of those populations.

This course meets GE Requirement for: Area C3 Introduction to the Humanities; the Writing Intensive; and Race and Ethnicity.

EDTE 150 Urban Education

This course examines historical and socioeconomic issues shaping urban education, as well as positive reforms that improve educational opportunities.

This course meets GE Requirements for: Area D2 Major Social Issues of the Contemporary Era; the Writing Intensive; and Race and Ethnicity.

EDTE 165 Sex Role Stereotyping in American Education

Students learn about gender socialization as it occurs in families and education, and the impact of gender bias on women in schooling and careers.

This course meets GE Requirements for: Area E Understanding Personal Development; and the Writing Intensive.
